

ABOUT THE COMPANY

L.A. Contemporary Dance Company (LACDC) is in its 8th season as Los Angeles' resident contemporary dance company. Our mission is to present vivacious and engaging dance experiences for the community by providing local dancers, choreographers and artists a stomping ground to craft the future of dance in L.A. and beyond. We take pride in the eclectic nature of L.A., which is reflected in our dancers and the dynamic spirit of our work. LACDC is a non-profit organization housed in the Brewery Arts Complex in downtown L.A. where we rehearse, perform and offer classes throughout the year. LACDC self-produces 2 - 3 productions each season, and performs an additional 5 - 6 productions presented by schools, universities and independent venues

LACDC has a history of taking its vibrant work and youthful energy on the road. We have performed at local venues both large and small the Diavolo Dance Space to the Broad Stage, Ford Amphitheatre, and Dorothy Chandler Pavilion. We have also toured work to the Baruch College for the Reverb Dance Festival in New York, NY and the Newman Center at the University of Denver, CO. We also enjoy bringing work to nearby partner theaters in Palm Springs (Coachella Repertory Theater), Ojai (Thacher School), and San Diego's outdoor Artwalk (presented by PGK Dance Project).

Artistic Director, Kate Hutter, founded the company in 2005 with her business partner, Michelle Mierz, while completing degrees at the University of Southern California. She then went on to pursue a MFA in Dance / Choreography at Purchase College. LACDC premiered in July 2005 at the Highways Performance Space in Santa Monica, CA. Since then, LACDC has consistently produced work and created over 30 original dance and multi-disciplinary pieces with over 80 dancers and collaborating artists.

Seven dancers, six singers and a single actor present a startling and epic investigation into the role of the gods in our lives and the influence of our passion and free will on our actions. The stunning movement of LACDC and the chilling vocals of ARORA (previously Sonos), combined with the wit of the narrator and contemporary vision of the directors, has produced a remarkable theatrical event unlike anything you have experienced before.

PRITE OEF STRINGH *Residency Program

8 dancers + 8 dancers (from local university or school) Choreography by Kate Hutter

"Prite Oef Stringh" re-imagines Stravinsky's *Rite of Spring* with the help of award-winning composer Austin Wintory and a powerful ensemble of 16 dancers. Together, they transport the legendary story of sacrifice to the playing field of a ritualized sport where survival of the fittest is the only way to overpower the pack, and win. *The Hunger Games* meets contemporary dance in this stirring and powerful piece showcasing the diverse talent and awe-inspiring performances of the LACDC dancers.

CATCH & RELEASE

6 dancers; Choreography by Kate Hutter

"Catch & Release" is a high octane and physically charged piece choreographed to the electronic music of gifted composer/producer Filip Zachary (aka Stropharia). In the music and in the dance, it is clear that the advances of our industrial civilization have left their mark, but our roots are still firmly planted in our primal nature.
